

Dear Mr. Jones,

The Gulf County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) accepted the recommendation of the Planning and Development Review Board and voted to grant preliminary approval to your client to proceed with permitting for the proposed borrow pit on CR 386. The BOCC with held final approval through a Development Order (DO) until the ERP is approved and the following development concerns are satisfactorily address:

- That the two drainage ditches that flows into Little Creek which then flows into Wetappo Creek has sufficient safeguards to prevent impacts from pollution runoff.
- That buffering from adjacent properties and sensitive environmental areas will accepted by both Boards based on the final pit location.
- That ERP and other permit development conditions are incorporated into the final development proposal.

Also as a word of caution and I am sure you are aware of the issue, there is a 100 AC/Yr. DRI threshold for mining and your client may want make sure that is not triggered when submitting the ERP application. As soon as your client receives all the required permitting approvals, please submit copies of all permits and the final development proposal to the PDRB and BOCC for their approval. Once the project is approved, a DO will be submitted to your client for acceptance and once accepted, construction of the project may begin.

Hillsborough, FL – The Florida Association of Counties (FAC) presented Gulf County Commissioners Nathan Peters, Jr. and Bill Williams with the Advanced Certified County Commissioner (ACC) designation and Commissioner Warren Yeager, Jr. with the Certified County Commissioner (CCC) designation following their completion of a comprehensive study program developed by the association. 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

I have been asked to respond to your letter on behalf of our Executive Director, Nick Wiley. Thank you for your comments regarding bay scallop season. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) received several similar requests to open bay scallop season early due to the Deepwater Horizon oil spill from Panhandle and Big Bend area businesses and residents. In response, the FWC issued an Executive Order to open bay scallop season 12 days early this year, on June 19. This action was taken to alleviate the economic impacts of the oil spill and to let people know that the majority of Florida is open and safe for fishing and seafood consumption, in spite of the mistaken impressions that the oil spill has affected most of our coastline and marine waters.

RESOLUTION NO. R-10-126

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, REGARDING THE ENVIRONMENT; URGING THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA TO CONVENE A SUMMIT FOR THE PRESERVATION OF FLORIDA'S SHORES, TO PROMOTE LEGISLATION FOR ROBUST, ALTERNATIVE/RENEWABLE ENERGY AND TO CALL A SPECIAL SESSION OF THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE FOR THE PURPOSE OF PLACING A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT BEFORE THE FLORIDA ELECTORS PROHIBITING OFFSHORE OIL DRILLING IN STATE WATERS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on April 20, 2010, the Deepwater Horizon drilling operation suffered a catastrophic failure; and

WHEREAS, in the fifty days since the catastrophic failure of the Deepwater Horizon drilling operation, and estimated 20,000 to 40,000 barrels of toxic crude oil have spewed into the Gulf of Mexico each of those fifty days, making it the biggest environmental catastrophe to ever take place within the United States; and

WHEREAS, the response of the United States Government has been organized pursuant to the Oil Pollution Act of 1990; and

WHEREAS, such response can only be judged as have been inadequate to preserve the shores, fisheries, lifestyle and economy of the sovereign State of Florida as witnessed by the presence of crude oil in the sovereign waters and on the sovereign land of the State of Florida.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Urging of Actions by Governor. The Governor of the State of Florida is hereby urged to distinguish himself in the preservation of the sovereignty of the State of Florida, and in so doing the economy and lifestyle of future generations of the State of Florida, by:

(1) Convening a Summit for the Preservation of Florida's Shores as follows:

- a. Such summit should include leading science and technology experts to explore new ideas and methods for coastal protection and clean up technologies, engage the premier experts from across the country, academia and the private sector in the ongoing response to the Deepwater Horizon oil spill, and examine and analyze both traditional and innovative approaches to marsh and wetlands oil clean up and remediation to identify the most promising alternatives and facilitate ongoing collaborations for both short and long-term response;
- b. Such summit should include the corporate heads, CEOs and global Vice Presidents of the competing oil companies to advise and inform the Governor as to their perspective on the response to this crisis;
- c. Such summit should include leading legal minds in the field to advise the State of Florida on the preservation of the sovereign rights of the state and its citizens in the face of this catastrophic environmental disaster; and
- d. The desired outcome of such summit will be to develop a protection and restoration program to assure the recovery of Florida's natural resources and tourism economy, and a funding strategy for such program and a possible call to action;

(2) Promoting robust alternative/renewable energy legislation while responding to this oil spill, setting forth a plan that will increase Florida's resilience to cyclical energy crises and the ever-present threats associated with exploration off of our coasts, while bolstering the alternative energy job sector to diversify the state's economy; and

(3) Calling a special session of the 2010 Florida Legislature to craft an amendment to the Florida Constitution to prohibit offshore oil drilling in waters of the State of Florida, and to place such amendment before the electors of Florida in the November 2010 General Election.

The County Administrator is directed to transmit copies of this Resolution to the Governor, the Florida Association of Counties, the chairmen of the boards of county commissioners of affected counties and the Manatee County legislative delegation.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause, or other provision of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not be construed as to render invalid or unconstitutional the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, or provisions of this Resolution.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.
