



Court Grants Partial Stay Of FCC Order On Interstate Inmate Calling Services

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit (Court) granted in part several motions for stay of the FCC's Order on Interstate Inmate Calling Services. FCC provisions 47 CFR §§64.6010 (Cost-Based Rates for Inmate Calling Services), 64.6020 (Interim Safe Harbor), and 64.6060 (Annual Reporting and Certification Requirement) which were adopted under the FCC's Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (ICS Order) have been stayed pending the Court's resolution of the petitions for review. The Court has directed the parties (Securus Technologies, Inc., Global Tel Link, Centurylink Public Communications, and the Mississippi Department of Public Corrections) to submit their briefings by **February 12, 2014**.

Background

The FCC adopted the ICS Order in September, 2013. (See *TMI Bulletins dated October 8 - 10, 2013, and November 13, 2013.*)

Subsequently, the FCC denied a petition by Securus Technologies, Inc., and Global Tel*Link asking for a stay of the ICS Order pending judicial appeal. (See *TMI Bulletin dated November 25, 2013.*)

Stay

Despite the FCC's arguments to the contrary, the Court found that the petitioners have satisfied the "stringent requirements for a stay pending court review."

Pursuant to the Court's Order, the following **three** FCC rules have been stayed:

- **§64.6010** requiring that all rates for inmate calling services (and all ancillary charges) be cost based;
- **§64.6020** setting forth specific "interim safe harbor" rates, which would be deemed lawful unless a decision was issued stating otherwise. and
- **§64.6060** requiring all providers to submit a detailed annual report and compliance certificate to the FCC by April 1st of each year.

Not Stayed

(Scheduled to Become Effective February 11, 2014)

The FCC's Interim Rate Cap (also known as the "hard cap") rule remains. §64.6030 establishes the following maximums on per minute Inmate Calling Services:

- Collect Call - \$0.25
- Debit/Prepaid/Prepaid Collect Call - \$0.21

Maximums on per 15-minute total call charges, including any per-call or per-connection charges, are set at:

- Collect Call - \$3.75
- Debit/Prepaid/Prepaid Collect Call - \$3.15

Additional charges for any form of TRS call and billing-related call blocking remain prohibited as set forth under §§64.6040 and 64.6050 respectively.
